

Flowers of Investiture or Rededication Ceremony

Use the following statements for as many scouts as you have in your group. This follows a flag ceremony and statement of GS Promise and Law. It is used in place of lighting candles. The girls come forward, one at a time. Each reads her part, then places her flower into a vase, until a large bouquet has been made. Alternatively, each scout recites her line then takes the flower to her parent in the audience. The leader may stress that the flower can be pressed in memory of this rededication or investiture.
